MUSIC IN THE NEWS

Every Thursday, 2 or 3 students will be responsible for sharing with the class some current information about something happening in the world of music. This information comes from a newspaper article, a magazine, the Internet, or from attending a live performance.

If you choose the Internet, newspaper or magazine article, it could be about a music personality, an up-coming concert, a concert review or anything else pertaining to music. Carefully read the article, (you will need to read it more than once), and make an outline of what you think is important and interesting. Then write a summary of the article **IN YOUR OWN WORDS (DO NOT PLAGIARIZE THE ARTICLE!)**.

It might be helpful to use as your guide the words WHO, WHAT, WHERE, WHEN and WHY when trying to decide what is important. If it's about a person, why are they in the news - what makes them important? Do not list facts about a performer's life.

If you are lucky enough to attend a live performance such as an orchestra, rap, or rock concert, ballet or musical, please share that with the class. Bring in the program, too. Include where and when the performance took place and describe costumes, scenery or special lighting effects. Also include what you liked the best and why (or maybe what you did not like about it). Do not forget to describe the music!

Include a cover page that has a picture or photocopy, and type 350 – 500 words of information on your subject, double-spaced. Make sure to check your spelling and write in complete sentences. Use paragraphs for each new idea. The purpose of this project is to expose the class to music they may not have encountered, and provide an exercise in finding articles concerning music in publications. You will be asked to read your review to the class on your assigned date. You may also play music related to your presentation. This is a major project so take your time and do your best. Include a reference, (a bibliography - magazine, book, newspaper, Internet address, etc.) to your source of information.

1. Cover page
 - Include your name!
2. Information
 - Include 350-500 words. If working with a partner, include 700-1000 words.
 - Double-spaced, typed, 12 - 14 point font.
 - Use paragraphs for each new idea.
3. Bibliography
 - Use <http://www.easybib.com> to create your bibliography
 - List ALL sources of information and pictures in your presentation.
 - You may include printouts or photocopies of source material.
